The most relevant GCSEs:

Students don't always need to have taken a particular subject to get into a given career. The subjects that are generally important for all careers are GCSE English, maths and science – all compulsory core subjects.

GCSEs for university?

Universities generally require, very achievable minimum GCSE grades, always from within the core GCSE subjects; for example, English 4/5, maths 4/5 and science 4/5.

University entry requirements are largely A level based. To take A levels you nearly always need a GCSE in that subject or one closely related, this way GCSE options may impact your university options.
